Requirements for Connecting to FreeBmoreWiFi

- You are physically within range of the FreeBmoreWiFi network signal.
- Your computer has built-in Wi-Fi or a compatible Wi-Fi adapter, and is in good working condition.

Steps to Connect

(1). Click the Wi-Fi Icon:

- Locate the Wi-Fi icon in the top-right corner of your screen.
- Click on it.

(2). Scan for Networks:

- Make sure Wi-Fi is turned “On.”
- Your computer will automatically scan for available networks. Look for “FreeBmoreWiFi” in the list of networks.

(3). Connect:

- Click on “FreeBmoreWiFi” then click the “Connect” button.
- When displayed, read the terms and conditions and click “Accept” to proceed.
- You will be automatically redirected to baltimorecity.gov.

(4). You’re Connected:

- Once connected, you can access the internet and use your computer like you would on any other public network.
